

AWARD NOMINATION INFORMATION

Interprofessional Professionalism Assessment Award Fall 2024 - Spring 2025

The [Interprofessional Professionalism Collaborative](#) (IPC), biannually (every other year) recognizes an interprofessional team or health professional faculty that have assessed interprofessional professionalism in practice settings that provide interprofessional practice and care.

The Interprofessional Professionalism Assessment Award acknowledges assessment of interprofessional professionalism with a goal of improved health care, knowledge, awareness, and/or behavior. The initiative must demonstrate a relationship between interprofessional professionalism and implications for practice or outcomes (practice, public health, education, and/or research).

Process, Eligibility, and Criteria

The online application form requires a (1) signed checklist; (2) cover sheet with brief description; (3) two-page narrative (including detailed documentation of impact); (4) abbreviated Principal Investigator (PI)/Group Leader CV (6 pages or less); and (5) outline of collaborator roles. Applicants may include optional supplementary materials such as pictures, a slide presentation (12 slides or less), and/or video short. References and additional materials will not count against the 2-page project description limitation.

Applications must include: representation by two or more health professions; and demonstrate a clear relationship between interprofessional professionalism and implications for practice or outcomes (practice, public health, education, and/or research). The application should provide a rationale for the interprofessional team's composition and function, discuss how assessment of interprofessional professionalism impacted outcomes, and indicate plans for publication such as a poster and/or journal article.

The project from each applicant will have assessed [interprofessional professionalism behaviors](#) as identified by IPC, demonstrated interprofessional professionalism as an important component of interprofessional collaborative practice, and identified implications for practice or outcomes (practice, public health, education, and/or research).

Each interprofessional team or health profession school can only submit one application.

Scoring/Evaluating

Applications will be reviewed by the IPC Award Review Committee. Applications will be judged in the following areas: Demonstration of interprofessional professionalism as an important component of interprofessional collaborative practice; and implications for practice or outcomes (practice, public health, education, and/or research) as a result of assessment of interprofessional professionalism.

Award decisions and notifications will be sent via email no later than June 30, 2024.

Award Presentation and Recognition

One Overall National Awardee will be selected and presented their award at Annual Summer IPEC Meeting in Washington, D.C. A webinar or continuing education publication will be developed by the winner.

AWARD APPLICATION CHECKLIST

ELIGIBILITY:

- Is the Principal Investigator/Group Lead involved in interprofessional education or practice? (Yes or No)
- Does your team have an interprofessional composition ("Interprofessional" would include representation by two or more health professions)? (Yes or No)
- Did the assessment project establish a relationship between interprofessional professionalism and improvements in practice or outcomes (practice, public health, education, and/or research)? (Yes or No)
- Did the project assess [interprofessional professionalism behaviors](#) as identified by IPC. (Yes or No)

AWARD CRITERIA GUIDELINES

Does your submission address the following?

- Demonstrate interprofessional professionalism as an important component of interprofessional collaborative practice (How and why are you using the interprofessional professionalism assessment tool?)
- Describe the implications for practice or outcomes (practice, public health, education, and/or research) as a result of assessment of interprofessional professionalism.

APPLICATION PACKAGE COMPONENTS

The following must be submitted online as separate files.

Note: References and supplemental material will not count against the 2-page project description.

- Completed checklist (signed copy)
- Rationale for the interprofessional team's composition and function
- Cover sheet (1 page)
- Narrative (2 pages or less) including:
 - Description and goal of assessment plan
 - Rationale and Approach (including methods, outcome measures, and project evaluation)
 - Results/Outcome (including implications for practice or outcomes (practice, public health, education, and/or research) and plans for publication)
- Abbreviated curriculum vitae of Principal Investigator (PI)/Group Lead (6 pages or less)
- Rationale for the interprofessional team's composition and function;
- Supplementary materials (optional):
 - Slide deck (12 slides or less), and/or
 - Pictures (upload online or submit via email to InterProfessionalCollaborative@gmail.com), and/or
 - Video short (upload online or email to InterProfessionalCollaborative@gmail.com if file too large)
